End of the year report from the Chairman

Well, it's certainly been a busy Autumn for me and Susan, with visits to local support groups in Lancashire, West Yorkshire, Merseyside, West Midlands, Cambridge and Lincolnshire. It's interesting to see how each group is quite distinctive and different but all providing essential support for people with vasculitis. Very often it's such a relief to be able to talk to someone else who actually understands the problems of living with vasculitis.

With fellow-trustee Richard Eastoe, we attended an open day for the bio-medical research unit at Imperial College. At the end of October, we went to Suffolk to take part in Tracy Martin's nautical themed Charity Ball in support of Vasculitis UK. This was held at Ickworth House – a very grand National Trust property and was a very splendid affair, raising over £2,500 for VUK.

On the "business" front, I've been to the British Society of Rheumatologists' HQ in London for a meeting to discuss the revision of the Guidelines for the treatment of Adult ANCA vasculitis. The meeting of the UK and Ireland Vasculitis Study Group (UKIVAS) was in Birmingham. This involved discussions about the new Vasculitis Registry (which VUK will be supporting financially), the new BSR Guidelines and the Paediatric ANCA Guidelines. It also gave me an opportunity to press for the development of some non-ANCA vasculitis guidelines.

Next week I will be meeting Professor Charles Pusey of Imperial College Medical School to discuss the planned setting up of a new multi-disciplinary Vasculitis centre at the Hammersmith Hospital.

Many thanks to those of you have contributed your experiences of Rituximab for inclusion in a report for NICE which will be submitted in the New Year. There is still time for you to send your contribution about your experiences (good or bad) if you haven't already done so. Please contact me for details.

So in conclusion, on behalf of all the Trustees of Vasculitis UK, may I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and Healthy New Year.

Jamie Flanagan of Edinburgh, who has raised a considerable amount of money for Vasculitis UK, was left deaf as a result of his vasculitis.




