UK'S NICE GIVE GREEN LIGHT TO RITUXIMAB



NICE has issued new Guidelines approving the use in the NHS of rituximab (MabThera) in treating the two most common types of ANCA vasculitis.

Vasculitis UK has been very actively campaigning for this for over a year.

In a statement, Vasculitis UK chairman John Mills said: "This will be good news for many patients living with ANCA vasculitis. It has been a hard fought battle. We have achieved most of our objectives and are so pleased to have been able to have a major influence this decision by getting the committee to understand the importance of this new drug for patients.

We are grateful to those patients who let us share their experiences of rituximab. These experiences formed a significant and influential part of our submission to NICE. We are also grateful to the leading vasculitis doctors who supported the campaign with their medical evidence. This is a perfect example of what can be achieved by medical professionals and patients working together in partnership".
